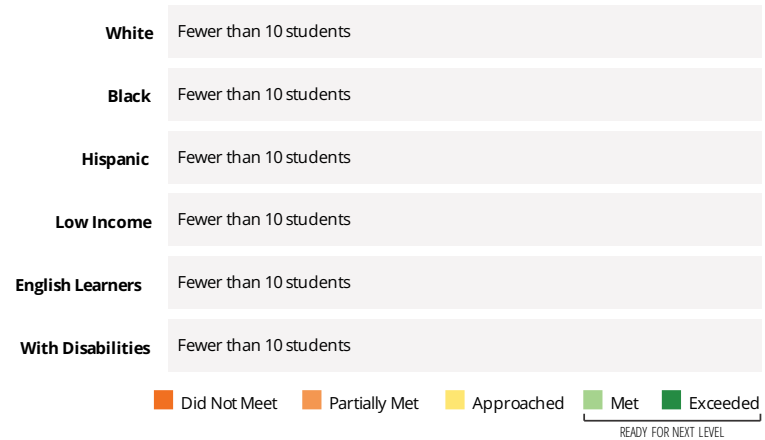
Academic Success

Success by Student Group

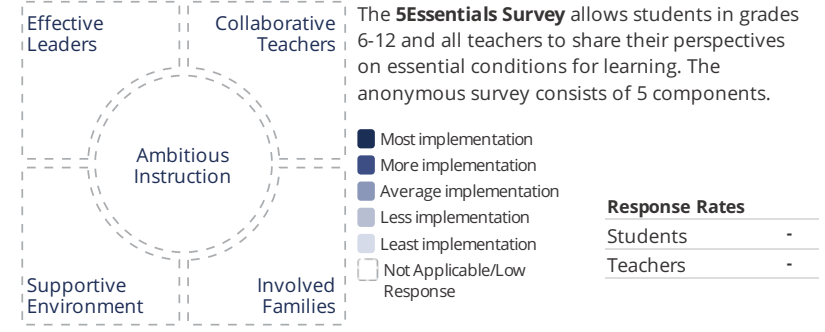
This display shows PARCC performance levels for each student group. No data is shown for groups with fewer than 10 students.

Facilities

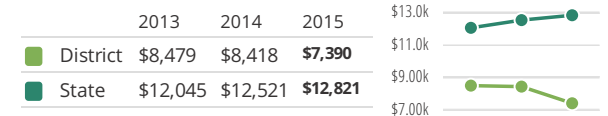
Jefferson Elementary is located at 1108 Grand Avenue in Johnston City. We are a PreK-2nd grade building. We have 3 sections of PreK that houses 60 students. Jefferson has 4 teachers in each grade level K-2nd grade. The average class size this school year is 20 students.
